**Subject:** Zoning Amendment Backyard Ducks

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

THAT Council receives this report for information.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Council received a request from a Mackenzie resident at the June 12, 2023 Regular Council meeting. The resident expressed a desire to keep backyard ducks and highlighted the benefits of urban farming, sustainable practices, and the educational opportunities associated with raising ducks in residential areas. Council directed staff to bring forward amendments to bylaws that would support this request for consideration.

Since then staff have brought forward amendments to the applicable bylaws and held a public hearing giving residents the opportunity to be heard. The following is a summary of the technical review from the agencies that staff contacted for referral as well as the results of the public hearing.

## **Public Hearing**

On July 27th, 2023, the District of Mackenzie held a public hearing to hear residents' concerns regarding the Official Community Plan amendment. At this meeting one resident spoke in favor to Council as well as 6 written statements 2 in favor and 4 against the bylaw amendment.

### Recommendation

As the wells that supply the town's drinking water are more than 30m away from any residential property that would be eligible for a backyard duck permit staff are recommending proceeding with Backyard Duck Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. 1503.
