**Subject:** Food Cycler Phase 2 – Next Steps

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

THAT Council directs staff on how to proceed with the Food Cycler Pilot Program.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

At the Regular Meeting of February 26, 2024 Council directed staff to bring back a report on directions for the food cycler program.

Since then, staff have gathered an interest list to continue the program. The interest list was posted online at letschatmackenzie.ca, social media, and staff held an in-person event at the Alexander Mackenzie mall for Earth Day. To date there are 42 residents interested in participating in a second round of the pilot program.

Staff have met with Food Cycler and have confirmed they will hold the 2023 prices for the 2024 year if we can commit to a second round.

Staff have also been in discussion with Public Works and they would use the excess soil amendment collected for parks and recreation projects.

As a reminder from last year the pilot program is supported financially by stacked funding from:

- FoodCycler, offering a \$200 \$250 per unit discount,
- Impact Canada (Federal innovation funds) with a \$50 \$100 grant per unit, and
- \$100 per unit Municipal subsidy + distribution and shipping.

## FoodCycler Pilot Program in Mackenzie

In the Official Community Plan Bylaw No. 1304, 2014 the District commits to reducing GHG's. The action relating to composting is:



 Encourage widespread adoption of composting and recycling, working with the Regional District.

For Phase 2, staff are recommending starting with the minimum pilot project amount of 50 units.
