- MVI 1 January @ 06:14 Report of an MVI on Hwy 97 south of the Junction. Upon the arrival of the crew there was nobody on scene. Crews taped off the vehicle before returning to the hall.
- AOA 6 January @ 09:11 Requested by BCAS for a Lift Assist. Crews were required to move a patient from their home and into an ambulance before returning to the hall.
- AOA 8 January @ 12:06 Requested by BCAS for a Lift Assist. Crews were required to move a patient from their home and into an ambulance before returning to the hall.
- AOA 11 January @ 08:22 Requested by BCAS for a Lift Assist. Crews were required to move a patient from their home and into an ambulance before returning to the hall.
- MVI 12 January @ 23:56 Report of an MVI on Hwy 97 south of McLeod Lake. While on route, crews received an update that there was no entrapment. The crew stood down and returned to the hall.



- AOA 14 January @ 10:03 Requested by BCAS for a Lift Assist. Crews were required to move a patient from their home and into an ambulance before returning to the hall.
- FAL 17 January @ 06:38 Report of an alarm activation at the hospital. Upon arrival of Chief 1 it was noted that the alarms were false due to construction work being done in the building. Chief 1 had the property rep reset the alarm before returning to the hall.
- PS 23 January @ 11:49 Received a call from 911 of a fire with someone trapped near Powder King. The call was generated from an I-phone SOS with little details. Chief 1 reached out to local RCMP and RCMP were able to call the phone and determine that everything was good. The RCMP determined that the owner was snowboarding, and the phone must have automatically called after some sort of impact.
- PS 23 January @ 11:49 Received a call from a concerned citizen that there might be a fire in the bush north of the tree crusher. Chief 1 investigated the area and determined that the smoke was generated from a logging truck that was idling on Skeena Drive. Chief 1 returned to the hall.
- FAL 27 January @ 09:53 Report of an alarm activation at Conifex. Upon arrival of Chief 1 it was noted that the alarms were false due to a bump in the system. Chief 1 had the property rep reset the alarm before returning to hall.
- MVI 30 January @ 02:26 Received a call from 911, that RCMP requested Mackenzie Rescue to attend a MVI on Hwy 97 near Bijoux Falls involving a semi tractor trailer. RCMP stated that the semi hit the meridian, there was nobody hurt or trapped, but fluids were leaking all over the highway. Chief 1 called EMCR to obtain permission to attend the incident and was denied authorization. The crew did not respond.
- MVI 30 January @ 02:26 Received a call from Local RCMP of an accident at the corner of Mackenzie Boulevard and Centennial Drive. RCMP informed Mackenzie Fire that they were out of town an hour away on another call and would not be attending the accident. RCMP asked Mackenzie Fire/Rescue to have the parties involved exchange information and to call a tow truck to remove the vehicles. The vehicles were able to drive to a safe location. Chief 1 & 2 returned to hall.
