We are reaching out to let you know about recent improvements to BC Housing's <u>Rental</u> Assistance Program (RAP) and <u>Shelter Aid for Elderly Renters (SAFER)</u> program.

RAP and SAFER help make rents affordable for low-income families and seniors by providing rent assistance in the private market.

Starting April 1, 2025, the Province <u>expanded eligibility</u> for the RAP and SAFER programs as well as increased the average benefit for existing recipients.

Improvements to RAP include:

- Increased the household income limit for eligibility from \$40,000 to \$60,000 (before taxes). This change is expected to nearly double the number of families eligible for support from around 3,200 to nearly 6,000;
- Increased the average family supplement for existing recipients from \$400 per month to \$700 per month;
- Reviewing and amending rent ceilings, which help determine the amount of rental assistance for applicants, annually; and
- Removed the requirement for employment income. This will result in low-income families, who are not receiving income or disability assistance, being able to receive rental assistance if other eligibility requirements are met.

Enhancements to SAFER include:

- Increased the household income limit for eligibility from \$37,240 to \$40,000. This change is expected to benefit up to 1,600 more seniors, and
- Increased the average supplement by nearly 30%, bringing the average monthly subsidy for existing seniors to \$337.
