Subject:	Minor Lacrosse – In-Kind Request

RECOMMENDATION:

THAT Council approves the in-kind request from the Mackenzie Minor Lacrosse Association to cover the arena rental fees for the tournament that was held May 13-14, 2023, as recommended by the Grant Adjudication Committee;

AND THAT Council consider directing staff to review the Community Grants Policy 1.26, the Recreation Services Rates and Fees Policy 8.1, and Recreation Fees and Charges Bylaw No. 1469, exploring a solution for providing non-profit societies with equitable in-kind or financial support for use of the Recreation Centre facilities.

BACKGROUND:

The community grants program supports non-profit organizations by providing financial and inkind support to community organizations. The community grant program has two in-take periods, September 15th of the preceding year and March 15th of the current year. As the March 15th in-take has passed, a special request is being brought forward from the Mackenzie Minor Lacrosse Association.

The Mackenzie Minor Lacrosse Association is requesting an in-kind grant to cover the rental fees for the tournament that was held May 13-14, 2023 at the Rec Centre. The rental fees were \$301.32 for the weekend.

The Grant Adjudication Committee has indicated that they would support this request, however; is also recommending a review of District fee policies for non-profit groups to ensure fairness in requests similar to this going forward.
